






Evening

On this scenic voyage, we'll call at Leith close to Edinburgh - with enough time for you to visit the castle and climb to Arthur's Seat if you choose. Explore historic Hadrian's Wall, its forts, milecastles and turrets.

Then it's on to Aberdeen, where Provost Skene's House, the huge Marischal College and Balmoral Castle - holiday home to the Royal Family - await. In the beautiful Scottish Highlands, we'll stop by famous Loch Ness, see Orkney's UNESCO World

Heritage Site and explore Fort William, which sits in the shadow of mighty Ben Nevis. Here you'll have the chance to taste smooth Scottish malts on a whisky tour and take a gondola up the slopes of Aonach Mor.

Wonders of Iceland

Calling at Greenock (Glasgow), Reykjavik, Isafjordur, Akureyri, Seydisfjordur, Djupivogur, Torshavn, Ullapool, Greenock (Glasgow)

Our Iceland voyage showcases the island's incredible natural scenery and wildlife.

Its capital, Reykjavik, is a fascinating place to explore and is the gateway to the Golden Circle in the southwest of the island. It's here you can experience Gullfoss waterfall, the Geysir and historic Thingvellir National Park, which is located between two tectonic plates.

As you travel around, you'll have the opportunity to search for puffins, ride sturdy Icelandic horses and go whale watching - Iceland's waters play host to over ten different species of whale. You can also go snorkelling in the 'clearest water on Earth', floating between two continents. Silfra is a fissure between the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates in Thingvellir National Park - and the experience exploring the gap is astounding. After incredible adventures, the most relaxing experience of the voyage will be soaking in the healing geothermal waters of the Blue Lagoon.







British Isles and Ireland Explorer

Sail around Ireland, the Isle of Man, England and the Channel Islands, taking in charming cities, beautiful gardens and sandy beaches.

In Northern Ireland, discover how Belfast has become a world-class city, wander through botanical gardens and follow in the footsteps of giants at the otherworldly Giant's Causeway.

We'll then journey south to Dublin for the opportunity to visit the Guinness Storehouse. Our time in England is about relaxing on Cornwall's glorious sands (including some of the beaches featured in Poldark) and tucking into traditional Cornish cream teas. It's then on to St Peter Port, the capital of Guernsey, where you can stroll down quaint streets, visit Castle Cornet or discover La Vallette Underground Military Museum. During your time here, you can also take a boat across to tiny Herm Island, with no cars, no crowds and a fascinating history.

Midnight Sun in the Arctic

Get ready for an Arctic adventure. For a couple of months here in summer, the sun doesn't set, resulting in the remarkable natural phenomenon of the midnight sun.

Our voyage around Norway visits Tromsø, letting you breathe in the fresh mountain air on scenic hikes or tackle the steps of man-made mountain stairways.

There's plenty of wildlife viewing, too, as we go in search of sperm whales and sea birds. Each summer, thousands of migratory birds return to breed in the mountains surrounding Longyearbyen, and everything from white-tailed eagles to puffins can be spotted on the cliffs and islands.

Best of the Baltics

See the fascinating cities of the Baltic Triangle in a new light from the water.

With an overnight stay in St Petersburg's, guests can visit it's many grand sites, including the Church of the Saviour on Spilled Blood, the vast Peterhof Palace, State Hermitage Museum, Peter and Paul Fortress and opulent Fabergé Museum Take a tour and stroll down Nevsky Prospect and experience a traditional night at the ballet.

In Gothenburg, Sweden, you can take a cruise along the 17th-Century canals, explore the Gothenburg archipelago by canoe or kayak – or take a RIB safari in search of seals. We'll also travel to Helsinki for a boat trip around the archipelago, a visit to the abstract Sibelius monument and time to unwind in an authentic Finnish sauna.

Fjords of Norway

In Stavanger, stroll past the white houses of the old town, take a cruise along Lysefjord and hike to Pulpit Rock, a sheer cliff that towers 600 metres above the Lysefjord and has jaw-dropping views.

We'll journey along the striking coastline to Bergen, where a traditional funicular ride up Mount Floyen offers far-reaching vistas over the city and excellent hiking trails. Bergen also hosts Norway's most famous outdoor market. The UNESCO World Heritage Site of Bryggen is a series of harbour-side Hanseatic heritage buildings and serves up excellent fresh fish.

English South Coast and Islands



This special voyage visits the Isle of Wight during Cowes Week – the world's oldest and largest annual sailing regatta. For sailing fans, this is a one-of-a-kind experience. Cowes Week dates back to 1826, and today around 8,000 competitors participate in the eight-day event. It's a remarkable way to see world-class sailing action, with champion yachtsmen and sailing enthusiasts all taking to the water. As well as watching the action unfold, we'll have an exclusive opportunity to join the celebrations, which include a dazzling firework display.

While on the Isle of Wight, we recommend sampling the afternoon tea at Northwood House Country Manor. For a taste of British culture, you could visit Farringford House, the home of Victorian poet, Lord Tennyson. Our voyage then sails on to Dartmouth, with its wild moorlands and river valleys. Dartmouth has a strong maritime history – it's home to the Britannia Royal Naval College, where the Queen first met Prince Philip, and it also has a small maritime museum overlooking the River Dart. During your time here, you could enjoy brunch at Agatha Christie's holiday home, Greenway House, which inspired some of her best-known books.

In pretty Falmouth, wander around the harbour's quaint galleries and quirky shops offering woolly hats, Cornish pasties and sweet homemade fudge. Leaving the mainland under full sail, we cross the ocean to the beautiful Isles of Scilly to discover local markets, National Maritime treasures and white-sand beaches that could rival the Caribbean, before heading to explore both St Peter Port in Guernsey and St Helier in Jersey.




Norwegian Fjords Adventure

Our Norwegian Fjords Adventure is packed with stunning natural scenery and adventures out on the water.



On land, explore Old Stavanger with its 18th-century white wooden houses, cobbled streets, galleries and craft shops. There's also the chance to hike to Pulpit Rock - the most famous lookout point in Norway, which drops 600 metres down a sheer cliff face into the Lysefjord. You'll also get to spend a marina day at Odda, where you can take the chance to admire

the stunning natural beauty of the fjord on a RIB ride excursion or take a sea kayak out and see how much wildlife you can spot.

Beautiful Denmark

Calling at Harwich, Skagen, Aalborg, Copenhagen, Frederikshavn, Harwich

Uncover Denmark's history, fairytale magic and mouth-watering food on this unforgettable tall ship voyage.

In Aalborg, you can step back in time as you explore this 15th-century city's cobbled streets, colourful crooked houses and cosy cafés, before venturing to see the effects of Europe's largest moving sand dune from the port of Skagen.

Trendy Copenhagen is a city of castles, canals and palaces. It's easy to explore on foot, so discover the pretty canal-side houses in Nyhavn and head to the waterside to view the famous bronze statue of the Little Mermaid. A must-visit is charming Tivoli Gardens - the magical place that inspired Walt Disney to create Disneyland.

Copenhagen also has world-class food; we recommend trying the famous Danish pastries. The city hosts the annual Copenhagen Cooking & Food Festival in August, where restaurants and gastronerds join forces to celebrate the city's food scene and impress visiting foodies.

Shore Experiences UK & Ireland



Invergordon

The small town of Invergordon is a departure point for one of Scotland's most famous spots. There's more to Loch Ness than its fabled monster: cruise out on the deep waters and you'll fall for its wild natural beauty and iconic lakeside attractions. Look out for Urquhart Castle, which is perched on a dramatic rocky point at the edge of the loch. This 1,000-year-old medieval fortress has a fascinating history and was eventually blown up in 1692. Take time to wander around the ruins, then head inside the excellent visitor centre to learn more. During our sailing, another shore excursion available from Invergordon is a visit to the stunning Rogie Falls on the Blackwater River.



Belfast

Northern Ireland's capital offers a great mix of sightseeing. In the city, there's Belfast Castle, the city hall and the botanical gardens, as well as lots of great restaurants and pubs. Outside of the city, you can explore Game of Thrones filming locations and head out to the impressive Giant's Causeway to follow in the footsteps of giants. This surreal UNESCO World Heritage Site is made up of 40,000 huge basalt columns that rise out of the sea – legend has it that it was created by an Irish giant during a fight with a rival giant from Scotland.



St. Ives

Journey to the picture-perfect St Ives, which is nestled on the north Cornish coast. The romantic coastal scenery here has lured generations of artists since the 1800's, seduced by the clarity of light and undeniable natural beauty. Wander down picturesque streets that tumble down to the sheltered harbour, browse the boutique shops or feel the sand between your toes on one of the award-winning beaches fringing the town. For those who seek culture, perhaps visit one of the several acclaimed galleries, including the world-renowned Tate St. Ives which is set overlooking beautiful Porthmeor beach.

Iceland

Reykjavik

Iceland's capital is the departure point for many of the island's attractions. The Blue Lagoon lies just outside of the city but feels like a world away thanks to its milky-blue geothermal waters, where you can lather yourself in mineral-rich mud for the ultimate natural spa day. Trips to Iceland's Golden Circle also leave from Reykjavik, taking in the natural wonders of Gullfoss waterfall, Thingvellir National Park and the Geysir. For something a little different, snorkel between two tectonic plates in Silfra.



Akureyri

Akureyri in northern Iceland is a top whale-watching spot and a natural adventure playground. Spot humpback, fin, blue, minke and sei whales, go rafting along the West Glacier River's gentle rapids against a rugged canyon backdrop, or ride a sturdy Icelandic horse out into the wilderness. If that all sounds too energetic, head to the glorious natural baths (a less-crowded alternative to the Blue Lagoon) to soak in the hot mineral water pools.



Seydisfjordur

The laid-back town of Seydisfjordur is located between two mountain peaks in the east of Iceland. It's known for its rocky beaches, puffin colony and traditional 19th-century timber houses that line the lagoon. Excursions here include hiking to Vestdalur Valley finding a series of striking waterfalls, and a visit to Skálanes to explore the 3,000-acre nature reserve.



Norway



Bergen

Pretty Bergen lies on Norway's southwestern coast, surrounded by fjords and mountains. One of its main attractions is the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Bryggen at the heart of the city, where colourful wooden houses front the water. There's a great fish market where you can sample the catch of the day and then wash it down with ice-cold drinks at the ice bar. Norwegian composer, Edvard Grieg, lived in Bergen, and you can visit his home on a guided tour. Or, for views of the city from above, take the funicular to the top of Mount Floyen.



Longyearbyen

Experience the midnight sun in the 'The Long Year Town' of Norway's Svalbard archipelago. In summer, the ice melts enough for ships to navigate the still icy waters, giving you a chance to view the wildlife – and the wild landscape. Another of our favourite Svalbard adventures is a boat adventure to 'bird mountain' with its steep dramatic walls that lean out into the open water.



Andenes

If you only pick one thing to do in the small fishing village of Andenes, make it whale watching. In the summer months, whale safaris head out on the search for sperm whales, pilot whales and magnificent orcas, with excellent success rates. There are also year-round bird-watching opportunities – look out for white-tailed eagles, gannets and puffins at the Bleiksøy bird colony.

The Baltics

St Petersburg

St Petersburg is packed with historical sights. Make the most of your time here by taking the 'Grand Tour' – a comprehensive two-day excursion that visits the city's most iconic spots. Tours typically include the remarkable onion-domed Church of the Saviour on Spilled Blood, the huge Winter Palace (now the State Hermitage Museum) and ornate St Isaac's Cathedral, as well as the Peter & Paul Fortress and Fabergé Museum. We'll stay overnight in port, which means there's the chance to spend an evening at the ballet.



Copenhagen

Cool and colourful Copenhagen has a strong royal history. Amalienborg Palace is still home to the Danish Royal Family – two of the four rococo palaces are open to visitors and each day at 12pm you can watch the changing of the guards. 400-year-old Rosenborg Castle showcases more royal regalia, including the coronation throne and crown jewels. Enjoy a traditional Danish pastry during your time here and take the chance to explore the city by bike.



Stockholm


Take a walking tour or bike ride around Sweden's capital to learn about its rich history. Explore medieval Gamla Stan's bright buildings and cobbled streets, visit the Royal Dramatic Theatre (founded in 1788) and see a preserved 17th-century ship at the Vasa Museum. ABBA fans can also take an interactive journey through the pop band's musical career at ABBA The Museum.



The Maritime Silk Route

As the UK Summer months draw to a close we follow the Sun south following the coastlines of France, Spain and Portugal entering the Mediterranean through the Straits of Gibraltar. Heading east enjoying balmy September weather Golden Horizon visits classic ports in Southern Spain & Italy before returning to her birth place in Croatia.

Golden Horizon then takes guests on a Maritime Silk adventure starting in Split. You can hop among Greek islands in search of ancient mythological sites, discover the lost city of Ubar in Oman or sail around Southern India's beach-studded coastline before navigating the Laccadive Sea en route to spectacular Bali.





Iberian Delights

28 Aug, 2021 \sim 10 Nights

Calling at Harwich, St Helier, Lorient, La Coruña, Vigo, Leixões, Lisbon

This scenic voyage takes us to the island of Jersey and around the south-west coast of Europe.

Jersey's capital, St Helier, has a beautiful sweeping bay and a yachtstudded marina that hosts the annual Jersey Boat Show, while over in France, the maritime town of Lorient is home to a World War II submarine base and is the gateway to charming towns and medieval castles. Our chosen stop in Spain is La Coruna, known for its ancient Roman lighthouse, the Tower of Hercules, which has breathtaking coastal views. We then sail to Leixões for Portugal's second largest city, Porto, with its stately bridges and colourful houses. Wander the cobbled streets of charming Ribeira, visit opulent São Francisco Church and sample the excellent port wine.

Southern Spain & Morocco Explorer

7 Sept, 2021 ~ 7 Nights

Calling at Lisbon, Cadiz, Tangier, Almeria, Mahon, Palma

Sail along Spain's southern coastline, exploring castles, cathedrals, harbours and islands.


Cadiz is thought to be the oldest inhabited city in Europe and has a long naval history. Home of the Spanish Navy, it has more than 100 watchtowers - head to the top of the Torre Tavira for views out over the city. There's also the opportunity to see the 18th-century Cadiz Cathedral, take a trip to Jerez de la Frontera (the sherry capital of Andalusia) and learn the art of flamenco dancing. Step ashore in Morocco to experience the highlights of Tangier, including its vibrant hillside medina, the part natural/part manmade Cave of Hercules and a Moroccan staple: mint tea. Back in Spain, we'll visit Almeria with its huge Alcazaba of Almeria citadel and rustic coastal views, then take in the colourful colonial buildings of Menorca's capital, Mahon.

Italian Discovery

14 Sep, 2021 ~ 9 Nights

Calling at Palma, Olbia, Naples, Lipari, Messina, Dubrovnik, Split

Our Italy voyage combines famous historical sites, dazzling beaches and idyllic coastal towns.



It's a breathtaking journey right from the start as we sail Sardinia's bright turquoise waters to Olbia and the long sandy beaches of Costa Smeralda. It's then on to the mainland and the city of Naples. With its ancient cultural attractions, delicious food and views of Mount Vesuvius, Naples is fascinating enough on its own, but from this storied city you can also travel to the pretty towns of Sorrento, Positano and Amalfi,

or visit the remarkable UNESCO World Heritage Site of Pompeii. More historical attractions await in Messina, including the cathedral and Fountain of Neptune with its huge marble monument of the sea god. After all that exploring, adventure awaits in the city of Dubrovnik.



Mediterranean and Passage through Suez

23 Sept, 2021 \sim 10 Nights \sim Calling at **Split**, Kefalonia, Kalamata, Chania, Alexandria, Suez Canal Transit. **Sharm El Sheikh**

The ship sets sail from Croatia's historical walled city of Dubrovnik. It's an unforgettable start to our voyage as we leave the port under full sail, backed by the terracotta-tiled town and calm blue-green Adriatic Sea.

Greece is another highlight of the trip – the Peloponnese is where the original Olympic Games were held and the Greek islands offer picture-perfect island-hopping adventures. We'll stop by a beautifuly secluded beach in Kefalonia where guests can explore the picturesque sandy beaches and crystal waters. In Egypt, we spend time in Alexandria, giving you the chance to add on our Cairo experience, a must-do if you want to see the colossal Pyramids of Giza. We then navigate the manmade waterway of the Suez Canal before disembarkign at Sharm el Sheikh, known for its incredible diving and beaches.



03 Oct, 2021 ~ 16 Nights

Calling at Sharm El Sheikh, Safaga, Jeddah, Djibouti, Salalah, Masirah Island, Muscat

Venture off the tourist trail and enjoy lesser-visited gems in Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Oman on our journey through the Gulf of Aden.

Oman's landscape is otherworldly at times. On the coast of East Africa, Djibouti has a remarkable landscape of its own: salt flats, volcanoes and the low-lying crater Lake Assal, where the salty waters offer a similar 'floating' experience to the Dead Sea... but without the crowds. In subtropical Salalah, the scent of frankincense trees wafts through the air. Ubar is a legendary lost city, while in the Dhofar mountains the scenery is lush and green, dotted with waterfalls and natural pools. Offshore, Masirah Island is a desert island of soft sandy beaches and thrilling watersports.

West India Coastal Explorer

19 Oct, 2021 ~ 9 Nights

Calling at Muscat, Porbandar, Diu, Mumbai, Ratnagiri, Goa


This enchanting voyage follows the west coast of India to Goa, taking in the highlights of Mumbai, Diu and Ratnagiri along the way.

After visiting Porbandar, the birthplace of Ghandi, we visit the teeny island of Diu, which sits just off the southern coast of Gujarat, India's northwestern state. Linked by a bridge to the mainland, it's an autonomous territory with a fascinating history. We then stop for an overnight stay in Mumbai, the vibrant city with a population of over 20 million. It's best known for its Indo-Saracenic Arch, the 'Gateaway To India', ts huge spice market and Bollywood entertainment. Lining the Arabian Sea in the western state of Maharashtra, Ratnagiri is a prolific producer of mangoes and cashew curries, and a gateway to the small, sandy beach resort of Ganpatipule and its lovelier neighbour, Neware Beach, which is easily reached by rickshaw.

South India and Sri Lanka

We'll sail around Southern India's beach-studded coastline before navigating the Laccadive Sea to Sri Lanka's capital.

Goa is one of India's top beach holiday destinations – an easygoing region of swaying palms, golden sands, fishing villages and 17th-century churches, while Kerala has over 350 miles of coast and serene backwaters. Kerala's main city is Thiruvananthapuram, and here you'll have the option to see the Padmanabhaswami Temple or visit an Ayurveda resort. In Kochi, a traditional houseboat experience drifting through the peaceful backwaters is a must and, when we reach Mangalore, the Udupi Sri Krishna temple is a fascinating sight to behold.







Bay of Bengal and the Malacca Straits

5 Nov, 2021 \sim 15 Nights \sim Calling at **Colombo**, Hambantota, Trincomalee, Port Blair, Swaraj Dweep, Ko Surin Tai, Similan Islands, Phuket, Ko Adang, Port Klang (Kuala Lumpur)

Join us on this diverse sailing, from Sri Lanka's wildlife-rich parks and India's idyllic Andaman Islands to Port Klang, close to Kuala Lumpur.



In Sri Lanka, incredible wildlife-viewing destinations include Yala National Park, one of the few places in the world where you can spot wild leopards. There's also the chance to see thousands of shorebirds at Bundala National Park and get up close with baby elephants at the Elephant Transit Home in Udawalawe, which takes care of orphaned

elephant calves until they can be released back into the wild. In Thailand, a visit to Phuket's Big Buddha and a speedboat ride to the lush Phi Phi Islands await. The ship then sails on to Port Klang, close to Kuala Lumpur.

The Malacca Straits and the Java Sea

20 Nov, 2021 \sim 10 Nights \sim Calling at **Port Klang (Kuala Lumpur)**, Malacca, Singapore, Pena Island, Tanjung Jang, Penyusuk, Belitung, Jakarta

Our journey begins in Kuala Lumpur, home to high-tech shopping malls and the iconic Petronas Towers, where you can stand on the gravity-defying Sky Bridge spanning these two skyscrapers

You'll have time to explore Singapore to discover street food, street art, maritime history and the futuristic 'supertrees' at the Gardens by the Bay. We'll then slow the pace down with a voyage west of Borneo to the lesser-visited island of Benua. On our way to Jakarta, we'll stop at four more idyllic islands, including secluded Belitung off the coast of Sumatra. With dreamy white-sand beaches dotted with huge granite boulders and very little tourism, tiny Belitung is the perfect place to unwind. There will be time to relax on Penyabong Beach, where you can swim in the calm clear waters and sunbathe on soft sands.

Indonesian Islands

30 Nov, 2021 \sim 8 Nights \sim Calling at **Jakarta**, Small Menjangan, Sowan Beach, Surabaya, Sapoong Bay, Gili Islands, Benoa (Bali)

Our Indonesian island-hopping sailing showcases the cities and beaches of Java. Lombok and Bali.

The ship sets sail from Java's cultural capital, Jakarta, and sails across the Java Sea. We'll stop at beautiful Sowan Beach for relaxation time on rustic golden sands before arriving in thriving Surabaya. From Surabaya, you can explore the Trowulan Historical Site with its ancient temples, or take a guided trip to dramatic Mount Bromo. On our homeward stretch towards Bali, we'll take in the Gili Islands, near the coast of northwest Lombok Island. The 3 islands, Gili Trawangan, Gili Meno and Gili Air, are known for their coral reefs just offshore, a diver's paradise.





Shore Experiences Egypt, Saudi Arabia & Oman

Alexandria, Egypt

Founded by Alexander the Great in 331 BC, Alexandria and its surrounds brim with historical sites. In the city, explore the 12-mile-long corniche and visit the National Museum. If you haven't been to Cairo before, it's well worth an early start to see the iconic Pyramids of Giza. The pyramids and sphinx are incredible feats of engineering, and the Great Pyramid is the only remaining Wonder of the Ancient World.



Jeddah, Saudi Arabia

Take the opportunity to learn more about Saudi Arabia, its people, past and trade in the city of Jeddah. You can visit holy mosques steeped in history, take in the enormity of the world's tallest manmade fountain or hit the shops at the sleek Mall of Arabia. This ancient trading city is on the maritime trade route, and time here is well-spent wandering through traditional souks, giving you a flavour of the past's maritime trade and exchange. The city also offers beaches and the opportunity for fantastic snorkelling and diving.



Salalah, Oman

Salalah has a beautiful landscape of banana plantations, frankincense trees and sandy beaches. Visit the fabled 'lost city' of Ubar – a kind of Atlantis of the desert – to see the spot where a city is said to have been swallowed by the Arabian sands, and discover surprisingly lush scenes of waterfalls and natural pools. Further attractions in the 'Empty Quarter Desert' include the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Wadi Dawka, which is a natural park of frankincense trees.

Thailand & Malaysia

Phuket

Phuket has a reputation as the original party island, but you'll find cultural attractions and epic landscapes here too. Take a guided tour to get up close to the Big Buddha that watches over the city and explore the Old Town with its brightly painted Sino-Portuguese shophouses. Offshore, Koh Phi Phi Don is one of the most popular islands in the country, while the vertical jungle-clad cliffs of uninhabited Phi Phi Leh are breathtakingly beautiful. Take a speedboat ride from Phuket to go for jungle walks and snorkel in turquoise waters.



Similan Islands

The remote Similan Islands are up there with the best snorkelling and diving destinations on earth. Whichever way you choose to explore the bright blue waters of this marine national park, you'll see psychedelic fish and thriving corals. It's also possible to spot manta rays, leopard sharks and even whale sharks.



Singapore

Visit one of Singapore's most iconic buildings – The Raffles Hotel. This hotel has been offering the finest service for over 120 years, and it's a must-visit for its stunning architecture, afternoon teas and a Singapore Sling at the famous Long Bar. Alternatively, experience this futuristic city on a tour, taking in Gardens by the Bay where you could find yourself looking up at solar-powered 'supertrees', finding yourself in a misty cloudforest or admiring the world's tallest indoor waterfall.



Circumnavigation of Australia

Join us for a circumnavigation of Australia – or choose a leg of the voyage to discover a region you've always wanted to visit. We'll give you the chance to dive the Great Barrier Reef, spend Christmas Day on the beach in the Whitsundays and take wild walks in search of koalas. Wander around fascinating art galleries, have a few glasses in the Yarra Valley and soak up the beauty of Australia's most remote coastal scenery.


















Indonesian Beaches and Northern Australia

8 Dec, 2021 \approx 14 Nights \approx Calling at **Benoa (Bali)**, Lombok (Labuhan), Komodo, Waingapu, Dili, Darwin, Thursday Island, Lizard Island, Cairns

From Bali, we'll voyage east towards the Lesser Sunda Islands, stopping off at sun-blessed beaches in Lombok - a surfers' paradise - and visiting Komodo at a time when the mountains seem to glow a jade-coloured hue.

Here you can relax on one of the pink sand beaches or discover Komodo National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site home to the Komodo dragon. We'll sail to the islands of Sumba and East Timor before Golden Horizon starts a circumnavigation of Australia, reaching Darwin and crossing the Gulf of Carpentaria down to the Great Barrier Reef and Cairns. In Darwin, explore the restaurant scene and galleries full of indigenous art. The Great Barrier Reef is waiting to be explored from Lizard Island before the voyage ends in Cairns, a vibrant city known as the gateway to the Daintree Rainforest.

Great Barrier Reef & Gold Coast Festivities

22 Dec, 2021 \approx 15 Nights \approx Calling at **Cairns**, Townsville, Whitsunday Islands (Whitehaven Beach & Airlie Beach), Brisbane, Mooloolaba, Trial Bay, Newcastle, Sydney

From Cairns, we'll sail south along Australia's iconic East Coast.

You can spend Christmas on the beach in the stunning Whitsundays, Whitehaven Beach, with its four-mile swathe of white silica sand, is regularly voted best in the world. The day after we visit Airlie Beach, a real-life paradise, with ribbons of white sand, tall palms and brilliant blue waters. The walking trails are recommended on this car-free island if you want to spot koalas and kangaroos; or dive under the waves to experience the Great Barrier Reef. Discover Brisbane's paddle steamers, botanic gardens and the Queensland Gallery of Modern Art before an unforgettable New Year's Eve watching the fireworks off Surfers Paradise, Gold Coast. After sailing along the Gold Coast on New Year's Day, we visit Trial bay and an overnight stay in Newcastle, before we end this voyage in vibrant Sydney.

South Australia and Tasmania Adventure

6 Jan, 2022 \sim 16 Nights \sim Calling at **Sydney**, Jarvis Bay, Batemans Bay, Eden, Darlington Bay, Hobart, Port Arthur, King Island, Melbourne, Victor Harbour, Penneshaw Kangaroo Island, Adelaide

We'll start in Sydney, then sail to the shores of Jervis Bay on board the luxurious Golden Horizon.




Here, you can kick back on white sand beaches and explore the striking Booderee National Park and Botanic Gardens. Continue south to Tasmania, where you can hop between art galleries or hike up the mountain of its vibrant capital, Hobart. Back on mainland, our next stop is Melbourne for an overnight stay offering two days to explore this stylish city. This is one of Australia's coolest cities, where craft beer bars are hidden in secret laneways

and street art is splashed across the walls (don't miss Hosier Lane). We recommend a day trip to Yarra Valley's award-winning wineries - you'll have time to search for sea lions and koalas on Kangaroo Island; and the Flinders Chase National Park is well worth a visit for its incredible rock formations and penguin colonies. The final stop on this part of the adventure is Adelaide.

Remote Southwest Australia

22 Jan, 2022 \sim 13 Nights \sim Calling at **Adelaide**, Penneshaw Kangaroo Island, Coffin Bay, Head of the Bight Lookout, Israelite Bay, Esperance, Bremer Bay, Albany, Busselton, Fremantle (Perth)

From Adelaide, we'll sail to Kangaroo Island. Nature reserves cover one third of the island, so you'll have the chance to see wild koalas and rare birdlife here.



We'll sail to South Australia's Coffin Bay, famous for its secluded coastline and watersports from sailing to diving - and make our way to the Head of Bight lookout, a great place for whale watching. Bremer Bay is known as a gateway to Fitzgerald River National Park, one of Australia's biggest national parks where you can spot birds on Wellstead Estuary and explore the heritage-listed dwellings of Wellstead Homestead. We'll then sail further south to the city of Albany, home to museums, galleries and restaurants, before docking in Perth's quirky port city, Fremantle.

Western Australia and Indonesian Islands

4 Feb, 2022 ~ 14 Nights

Calling at Fremantle (Perth), Jurien Bay, Geraldton, Monkey Mia, Coral Bay, Broome, Komodo, Lombok, **Benoa (Bali)**

After you've explored the bohemian boutiques and seafood shacks of Fremantle, we'll board Golden Horizon and sail to littleexplored fishing town Jurien Bay, known for its long sandy beaches and colourful reefs.

We'll visit Monkey Mia, known for the wild bottlenose dolphins that come up to the beach each day; and spend some time relaxing on the remote white sand beaches of Broome. As the wind flicks the sails, we'll head north of Australia to Komodo, home of the Komodo dragon, and cruise to the picture-perfect beaches edging Lombok, before ending this voyage in Bali.



Shore Experiences Australia



Hobart, Tasmania

Hobart in Tasmania is set on the River Derwent estuary and is one of the world's greatest sailing cities and harbours. You can climb a mountain, view captivating modern art or eat fish and chips from one of the floating punts in the docks. There are markets to explore, history to uncover and the chance to discover Mount Field National Park, a eucalyptus rainforest with alpine moorland and captivating waterfalls and lakes. Don't miss the Tasmanian devils at Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary or join the Tassie Tasting Trail and savour the tastes of the local oysters.



Melbourne

There's so much to see and do in the beautiful city of Melbourne that we have scheduled an overnight stop here. You can journey along the Great Ocean Road and capture the astounding natural scenery through your camera lens. Take a city tour that ticks off St Patrick's Cathedral, Queen Victoria Market and the city's arcades and laneways. It's also a great chance to learn about Melbourne's quirks and history. The stunning Yarra Valley lies on the outskirts of the city and produces Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and sparkling wines. Taste a few varieties and learn about the traditional methods used in this acclaimed wine region.



Kangaroo Island

It's all about the wildlife on Kangaroo Island. In Flinders Chase National Park, take a walk through the bushland with a guide and keep a look-out for wallabies, echidnas and the elusive platypus. The island also has an incredible Food and Wine Trail, which links local farms that will welcome you in to try tasty wines, honey, cheese, yoghurt or products made from eucalyptus oil.



At the northern edge of Princess Royal Harbour lies Albany, Western Australia's oldest settlement. The harbour is part of King George Sound, keep watch for eagles and hawks above as we sail into the harbour. You can see wild kangaroos, try a damper – bread that was a staple of the early Australian settlers – and soak up the dramatic coastal scenery, with its rugged shorelines, sweeping white sand beaches and national park headland.



There's the chance to learn about Albany's infamous whaling past, see the station and step on board a whale chaser ship to be dwarfed by enormous whale skeletons. It's haunting but the mood is uplifted with presentations celebrating the beauty of whales. A trip here is also a great chance to learn about Albany's history in World War I at the National Anzac Centre, through both artefacts and interactive technology.


Komodo Island

North of Australia is Komodo Island, part of the Lesser Sunda chain of Indonesian islands. It's here that you'll find a rugged habitat of red volcanic hills, savannah and forests home to the Komodo dragon monitor lizard. Komodo National Park covers the entire region and is home to more than 4,000 dragons, helping to protect this unique species and its local eco-system. Ask us to book a tour with an expert guide, as visitor numbers are limited. The island is also famous for its pink sand beach, one of only seven in the world.



Circumnavigation of the Indian Ocean

Relax on perfect beaches in the Maldives and visit uninhabited Cocos Islands. You can dive some of the world's best underwater locations and gaze over astounding landscapes, including Reunion Island's emerald-coloured volcanic peaks and tumbling waterfalls. Then there's the history of Stone Town in Zanzibar, with time to admire a former sultan's palace, aqueducts and huge carved doorways at every turn, plus Sri Lanka's astounding wildlife, from wild elephants to elusive leopards.





Southern Indian Ocean Sailing

18 Feb, 2022 \sim 16 Nights

Calling at Benoa (Bali), Christmas Island, Cocos, Rodrigues, Mauritius

This special sailing uses the easterly trade winds to cross the vast Indian Ocean, stopping at untouched and beautiful islands along the way.

Departing from the tropical Indonesian island of Bali, we'll set sail for Christmas Island – a unique Australian territory south of Java that's known for its thriving coral reefs, lush rainforest, nesting seabirds and red crab migration. There's incredible diving here, too. Then it's on to the remote Cocos Islands where palm-fringed white-sand beaches await, followed by peaceful Rodrigues Island. You'll notice that life on Rodrigues takes on a slower pace – it's the perfect place for an authentic insight into local culture. You can also see beautiful historic buildings and giant tortoises. Our final stop is the popular holiday island of Mauritius, which combines stunning beaches with botanical gardens, tumbling waterfalls and incredible street food.

Mauritius, Madagascar and East Africa

6 Mar, 2022 \sim 13 Nights \sim Calling at **Mauritius**, La Reunion, Toamasina, Antsiranana, Nosy Be, Moroni, **Dar Es Salam**

Our African voyage takes us from the tropical Indian Ocean islands of Mauritius and Reunion to the volcanic Comoros and nature-rich Madagascar.

Reunion is like a mini Hawaii, packed with thundering waterfalls, volcanic peaks, golden beaches and thick green wilderness – it's ideal for off-the-beaten track adventures. On this sailing there's plenty of time to explore the diverse landscapes of Madagascar as we stop at historical port cities, coastal towns and idyllic islands. Take in the sweet scent of vanilla from the island's plantations, see rare orchids and try to spot one of the many species of lemur. As the ship sails towards mainland Africa, we'll visit the Comoro Islands – a lesser-visited archipelago with clear blue waters and a fascinating capital – before arriving in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

Tanzania to the Seychelles

19 Mar, 2022 ~ 13 Nights

Calling at **Dar Es Salam**, Zanzibar, Astove Island, Alphonse Island, Desroches Island, **Victoria**

Join us on an unforgettable Indian Ocean adventure from Tanzania to the Seychelles.

We'll leave the African mainland behind as we sail towards the 'spice island' of Zanzibar, known for its spice plantations, wide sandy beaches and UNESCO-listed capital, Stone Town. The ship then glides across the ocean to the picture-perfect Seychelles archipelago, where highlights include Astove Island with its large inner lagoon, migratory waders and remarkable sheer drop-offs known as the 'Astove Wall'. We'll also visit the pristine private island of Alphonse and lush Desroches Island, offering great diving and a real castaway experience – the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge have holidayed here. Our final stop is Victoria on Mahé island, the capital of the Seychelles, buzzing with markets and local life.

Exploring the Seychelles Archipelago

The island is walkable in around an hour and the perfect place to experience a slow pace of island life. We'll test out a selection of the region's best beaches and have time to get the marina down, giving you the chance to make the most of the watersports we offer. Sailing around these picture-perfect islands offers a different take on an unforgettable beach holiday.





Indian Oce**an** Paradise

Calling at Victoria, Le Digue, Hithadoo, Maldives Beach, Male, Colombo

See some of the world's most breathtaking islands on our journey around the Seychelles and the Maldives.



A tall ship voyage is an incredible way to explore this part of the Indian Ocean, sailing from one dazzling island to another for adventures above and below the water. We'll set sail from the capital of the Seychelles, Victoria, to spectacular La Digue - one of the Seychelles' most photographed islands thanks to its beautiful beaches and giant granite

boulders that tumble down into the clear, calm waters. After a few scenic days at sea, we'll arrive in the Maldives for plenty of time to unwind on pure white sands and use the watersports facilities from our marina. This voyage ends in Colombo, the buzzing capital of Sri Lanka.

Sri Lanka to Kuala Lumpur

17 Apr, 2022 ~ 12 Nights

Calling at Colombo, Hambantota, Trincomalee, Sabang, Banda Aceh, Ko Adang, Langkawi, Port Klang (Kuala Lumpur)

Sail from Sri Lanka to Port Klang in Malaysia, discovering national parks, historic towns and unspoilt beaches.

Our first stops will be Hambantota - close to Yala for game drives to spot elephants and leopards - and Trincomalee, home to a historic fort and incredible temples. There's the chance to see baby elephants at a remarkable elephant sanctuary called The Elephant Transit Home in Udawalawe; and our April sailing will give you prime chance of seeing blue whales rising from the ocean. In Malaysia, highlights include strolling along the soft sands of Langkawi, taking the SkyCab to Mount Mat Cincang and seeing Kuala Lumpur's sky-high Petronas Towers.



Shore Experiences Madagascar

Antisiranana

The lively northern port city of Antsiranana (known as Diego Suarez until 1975) has wide streets lined with historic buildings, quality restaurants and a buzzing craft market, which has stunning views over the bay. It's a great departure point for Amber Mountain Park – one of the first places to receive national park protection in Madagascar – where you can hike through the rainforest in search of waterfalls, crater lakes, lemurs and other endemic flora and fauna.



Toamasina

The east coast port city of Toamasina has a fascinating old town with Creole houses built on stilts. Stroll along the wide avenues and coral beaches, and pause to look up at the towering banyan trees and crumbling mansion in Place Bien Aimé. A short cruise on the calm waters of the man-made Pangalanes Canal – the longest canal in the world – is a must. Visit local fishing villages, watch fishermen navigate the waters in traditional dugout canoes, and see the region's lush flora and fauna.



Comoro Islands

The remote Comoro Islands (or Comoros) are a group of mostly uninhabited islands that lie to the northwest of Madagascar. These volcanic islands offer a glorious step off the tourist trail. From the capital, Moroni, you can reach dazzling deserted beaches, visit ylang ylang production facilities and learn about local tribes and ancient cultures. For an unforgettable and otherworldly experience, go diving in the blue-green waters of the Mayotte Lagoon.



Zanzibar

There are plenty of things to do on Tanzania's 'spice island'. Stone Town is a must-visit – it's the oldest part of the island's capital and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This coastal city is a rich mix of Arabian, Indian, African, Persian and Portuguese influences, with narrow winding streets, buzzing bazaars and weathered colonial buildings. Around the island you can also visit Jambiani Village to meet friendly local families, take a boat trip to Prison Island to see giant Aldabra tortoises and snorkel in clear blue waters



Christmas Island

This Australian territory south of Java is a nature lover's dream. 63% of the island has been given national park status and its location close to South-East Asia means the flora and fauna here is remarkably diverse. Exploring the island on a tour will give you the chance to see unique and endangered species that can't be found anywhere else in the world. Snorkel and dive in marine-rich waters with thriving coral reefs, go bird watching or try your hand at fishing. You can also learn about the island's unique red crab migration.



Cocos (Keeling) Islands

The remote Cocos is another Australian territory in the Indian Ocean. This idyllic archipelago is made up of 27 mostly uninhabited islands of swaying palms, frosted white sands and glistening lagoons. There's plenty to see and do: discover the bird colonies of Pulu Keeling National Park, dive to a shipwreck, visit the cultural Home Island Museum or try out the watersports on offer – from kayaking to stand-up paddle boarding – in the calm lagoon.


